SENIOR FRIENDLY COMPUTER CLASSES

All Classes are held in a computer lab with a computer for each student. Our computers run Windows XP.

- **Graphics:** Learn to make your own greeting cards, address labels, calendars, business cards and more using Printshop. Students must have basic computer skills before taking this class. (6 weeks)
- **Intro to Photoshop Elements:** Learn to use Photoshop Elements to make the most of your digital photos. This class is designed for those who already have photos on a CD or digital camera. (6 weeks)
- **Advanced Photoshop Elements: A** continuation of the Intro class, for those who have some Photoshop Elements experience. (6 weeks)

- **Introduction to Computers:** Covers basic personal computer hardware and software. Learn how to access the internet, word processing and basic file management. Designed for the novice user who wants a better understanding of how to use computers. (6 weeks)
- **Microsoft Word:** Learn the basics. Must have basic understanding of computers. (6 weeks)
- **Manage Photos with Picasa2 in 3 Weeks:** Learn an unusually good, free photo management program. Easy photo enhancement, print, share, backup and more! (3 weeks)
- **After the Basics:** After learning the basics, this class will teach you what Windows can do for you - creating, organizing, saving and more. (6 weeks)

GENERAL INFO FOR KIDS' CLASSES

The Science Center is a private, non-profit educational institution. Our classes are designed for students of all ages. We welcome students without regard to creed or ethnic origin.

● PAYMENTS

Payments for Science Center workshops are by cash, check, MasterCard or Visa. Make checks payable to "The Science Center". Please put your driver's license number in the memo section of your check.

● REFUNDS

Complete refunds are given for the following circumstances only:
-Applicants move out of the city prior to class.
-Death in the family.

● CANCELLATIONS

If a class is cancelled due to insufficient enrollment, you will be notified and receive a full refund.

● RETURNED CHECKS

A \$30.00 fee will be charged for returned checks.

● CONFIRMATIONS

The Science Center does NOT send out confirmation letters for forms received in the mail. The forms are processed and students are registered.

● TRANSFER FEES

There is a \$10 processing fee for transferring your child from one class to another.

● ARRIVAL INFORMATION

Any student arriving before 8:30 am must remain with an adult. The Science Center does not open for Extended Care until 8:30 am.

● PICK UP INFORMATION

Students picked up from Extended Care (after 3:30 pm) MUST be signed out from the Discovery Center by a parent or designated adult.

● EARLY PICK UP

If a student is picked up early, you must notify the front office and the teacher before you leave.



● LATE FEES

All students MUST be picked up by 5:30 pm. There will be a \$5 late pick up charge for the first 15 minutes (5:30 - 5:45 pm) and an additional \$1 per minute per child late pick up charge for each additional minute after 5:45 p.m. NO EXCEPTIONS.

● NOTES TO PARENTS

- Any parent who wants to visit his/her child's class, must check in at the front office and get a visitor's pass.
- Children must bring lunch, snacks and drinks daily. No lunch will be provided or ordered.
- Students are given breaks mid-morning and mid-afternoon. Snack and soft drink machines are available. Snacks are 60¢ - 75¢ and soft drinks are \$1.00. SNACKS ARE NOT PROVIDED BY THE SCIENCE CENTER.
- Please notify us of nut or other allergies.
- For safety, all students must wear closed-toe shoes and appropriate clothing.
- If a student has a problem that needs special attention, please advise us at the time of registration.
- Registration hours: 9 am - 4 pm, Mon.-Fri.
- A City bus stop is located at the front entrance to the Science Center. For more information call the Transit Dept. at 727-530-9911.

● DISCLAIMER

Workshop descriptions are written well in advance of camp dates. While the Science Center strives to follow descriptions listed in this brochure, there is a possibility that circumstances beyond our control (i.e. weather) might change the description to some extent. Any such changes will not detract from the fun, hands-on and creative classes that help our students discover science.

● DISCIPLINE

All parents, upon registration, will be given a discipline policy/student code of conduct sheet. Please discuss these with your child to ensure a safe and pleasant experience for all.

A week of science-themed daily activities including:

● **Monday, March 26 - Insects!** (SB-Mon-26)

Start the week with a full day of science fun! Because of the incredible way insects have woven their way into just about every subject of human study, our insect-related theme represents a wealth of topics to motivate and inspire students of all ages.

● **Tuesday, March 27 - Marine Biology** (SB-Tues-27)

Our 600-gallon touch tank is today's laboratory. Sharks to starfish all share the same environment and you will be able to touch many different marine animals as you study this wet subject.

● **Wednesday, March 28 - Animal Insides** (SB-Wed-28)

Interested in how a body works? Join our animal specialist while we examine both warm and cold blooded animals. We will compare and explain the anatomical differences among many different animals - and see how these differences allow the animals to adapt and survive.



● **Thursday, March 29 - Extraterrestrial to Terrestrial** (SB-Thu-29)

Be an astronomer, geologist and a volcanologist as we unlock the mysteries of our universe. Visit our planetarium and our brand new lapidary lab.

● **Friday, March 30 - Physical Science** (SB-Fri-30)

Wrap up the week! Chemistry and physics take center stage as a variety of hands-on experiments illustrate scientific principles.

- An upset or crying child should be taken out of the classroom. When he/she feels better, they can return to class.
- Adults are asked to encourage the children to be as quiet as possible.
- For safety reasons, please no running or climbing in the Science Center.

● Class Descriptions

Don’t Duck, Look Up!:

A fun, friendly and interactive exploration of the sky in our Spirit of Columbia Planetarium and Theater. This pre-recorded show is designed especially for Pre-K through 1st grade. Children should be comfortable in a darkened theater setting for approximately 20 minutes.

Furry Friends:

Meet and learn about several of our warm-blooded animal friends.



My Amazing Body:

Listen to your heartbeat, make a fingerprint and learn how our bodies function as we meet “Mr. Bones” and “Mr. Body.”

Florida’s First People: Learn how Florida’s earliest inhabitants lived. Includes a guided visit to our 16th Century Indian Village, weather permitting.

Sea Creatures:

Learn about marine animals that live in the waters of Tampa Bay, Boca Ciega Bay and the Gulf of Mexico. Includes an opportunity to touch the inhabitants of our 600-gallon touch tank.



Scaly or Slimy?: Meet and learn about reptiles (scaly) and amphibians (slimy).



Creepy Critters: Learn about some of our more unusual animals, including arachnids, insects, and Madagascar Hissing Roaches.

My Five Senses: Activities illustrate how we learn about our surroundings by seeing, hearing, touching, smelling and tasting.

Magnetic Attraction:

Learn about magnetism by experimenting with magnets & magnetic fields.

Discover A Rainbow: (Four & Five year-olds only please) Discover the colors of the rainbow. See “real” rainbows in the classroom. Experiment with primary colors to make new colors.

Warm-Blooded/Cold-Blooded:

Meet some of our animal friends and decide if they are warm-blooded or cold-blooded.

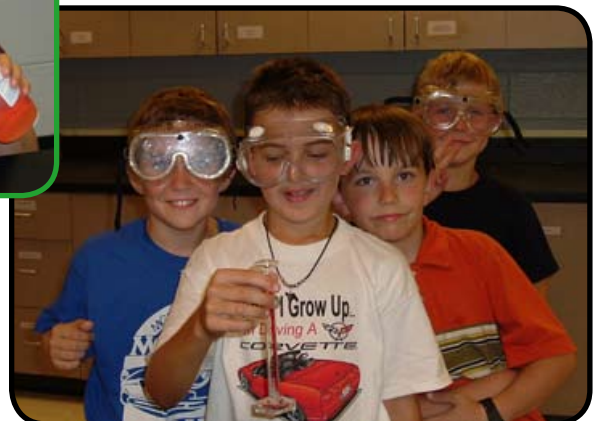
